



Legacies

Legacy appeals are a delicate subject. For many, the priority will be to provide for your own family. However, once this provision has been made, you may wish to consider leaving a gift to support the work of the Kohima Educational Trust.

Legacy income makes a significant contribution to many charities and greatly assists our work.

It is easy to do. Rather than having to write a new Will, you can leave a legacy by means of a codicil, which supplements the existing terms of the Will.

A bequest can take a number of forms, two of the most popular are set out below.

A Pecuniary Legacy

This involves leaving a specific sum to a named organisation. To avoid possible erosion of the value by inflation, a bequest can be index-linked to preserve its value for the future, and your solicitor will provide you with the wording to do this.

A Residuary (or percentage) Gift

Specific pecuniary bequests can be eroded by inflation or, if the overall value of the Estate falls, it could mean that the proportion of the estate given was more than the donor intended. A way around this is to bequeath a percentage or fraction of the residue of your Estate after your specific bequests have been made.

We recommend that anybody contemplating such action should consult a solicitor for advice before making final decisions.
